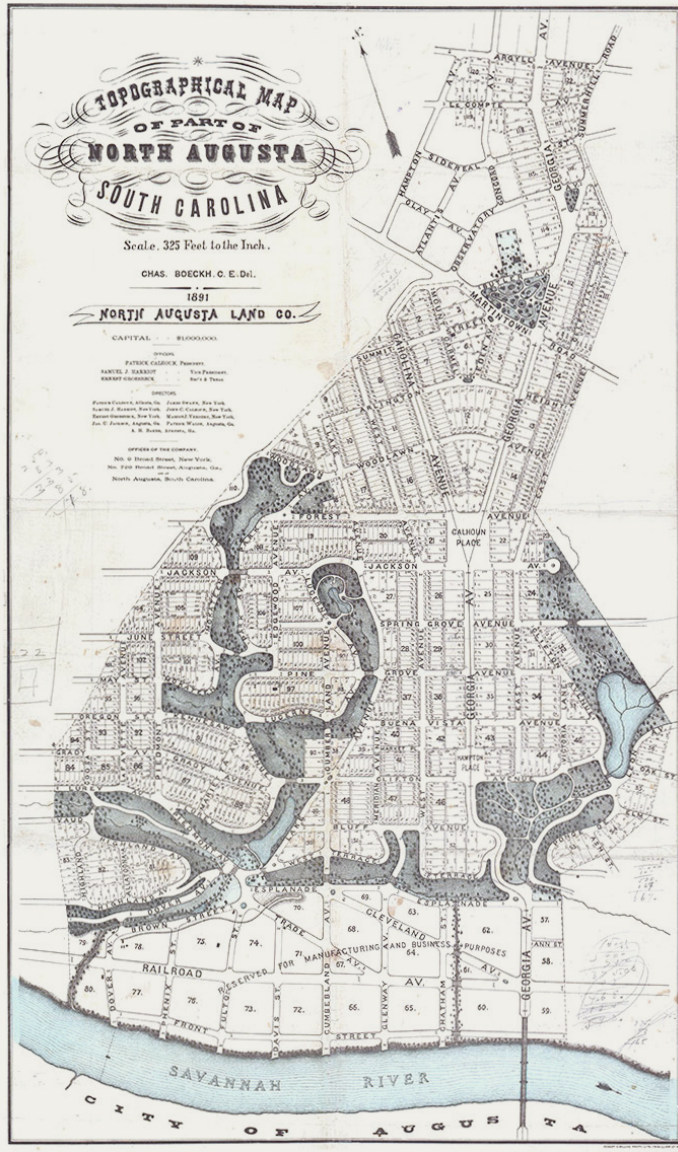

The Story

The city has a certain degree of “Up & Coming”: Home of the North Augusta Greenjackets, expanding renewables, and nearby growing manufacturing facilities, North Augusta is part of what’s become an attractive region with a recent track record of massive growth.

Yet, like every place, there is a broken side to North Augusta. Her story includes worldly ambition, broken families, and economic disparity.

North Augusta has recently seen significant economic growth, but it remains the largest city in South Carolina without a PCA church.

We hope to change that. We want to see God’s Kingdom come to North Augusta as it is in heaven, specifically through the establishment of a new church that will acclaim God’s fame for generations to come.

To that end, the vision of North Augusta Fellowship is to see God's fame made public, to help Jesus' followers look more like Him, and to experience North Augusta being blessed by God's work among us.

Oversight & Strategic Partners

Our church will be under the oversight of the Palmetto Presbytery (PCA), led by a temporary session consisting of ordained teaching elders and ruling elders from the presbytery. Jason will also be coached by seasoned church planting coaches, led by Kevin Thumpston, Church Planting Director. Abbye will be involved with Parakaleo, the PCA's ministry to wives of church planters.

North Augusta Fellowship will be a congregation that exists for our friends and neighbors who do not yet know Jesus. While we desire to see the gospel affect each part of North Augusta, our hearts are especially burdened for those who are presently disconnected from Jesus and the life of his Church. We long to see our spiritually disillusioned friends and neighbors find deep belonging in a community of grace where the Good News is proclaimed and demonstrated.



The Church Planting Family

Jason and Abbye are no strangers to ministry. Jason grew up outside of Pittsburgh, PA, in a Christian home. He received his B.S. in Music Education from Bob Jones University and his Master of Divinity from Reformed Theological Seminary Charlotte. After serving in a number of areas as a member at Downtown Presbyterian Church, he went on staff at Shannon Forest PCA (now Eastside PCA) and has spent the last 6.5 years as Assistant Pastor at Christ Community PCA in Simpsonville, SC. At Christ Community he lead worship, taught 3-year-olds, preached, administered sacraments, and led a community group which has grown and multiplied. He was ordained as a teaching elder in the PCA in 2013. He also has a variety of experience in the non-profit, para-church, and corporate sectors. He's usually talking sports (he bleeds black & gold), finding deals on hot wings, cracking Dad jokes, and/or playing with his children.

Abbye grew up in Watkinsville, GA, and her family regularly attended church. She received her B.A. in Religion and Minored in both History & Christian Education from Presbyterian College. She spent 6 years on staff with Campus Outreach Greenville where she helped launch a new chapter at Clemson University and later became Regional Women's Director. She has taught Sunday School, led Bible studies, started Mentor Moms at her church, and coached other women in ministry. When not keeping tiny humans alive, Abbye is cheering on her beloved UGA Bulldogs (Go Dawgs!), enjoying a cup of coffee, or reading a great book.

Jason and Abbye are joined by their older son, Joseph, their younger son, Patrick, and their daughter, Ivye. They were given approval to plant at the 2014 Mission to North America Church Planter Assessment.

OUR CORE VALUES

1. Story (Ephesians 2:4-9)

Everyone is formed by some type of narrative. We are formed by the Greatest Story, namely, the Good News. God has created this world, man has sinned and fallen, Jesus has come into this world, God's Spirit has been sent to live within us, and Jesus is making all things new. This Greatest Story forms our fellowship.

2. Presence (Jeremiah 29:4-9)

We're here for the well-being of North Augusta & the CSRA. We're here for the good, the bad, and the ugly. We want to use what resources and talents we have to serve the region. We are a fellowship here for North Augusta.

3. Attentive (Colossians 4:2-6)

We want to listen to those around us and give Gospel-soaked answers to the questions that are being asked. We want to avoid jargon & "shop talk" so that we don't get in the way of telling the best Message there is. We are a Fellowship marked by Attentiveness.

4. Culture (Genesis 1:26-28)

In light of the Cultural Mandate, we see to build a culture and an atmosphere that sees work as worthy and vocations as callings. Stewarding talents & resources for our good & the good of those around us fuels the mission of our fellowship.

5. Exponential (Matthew 28:18-20; Ephesians 4:11-16)

We're seeking to be a church that multiplies. Rather than being drawn in upon ourselves, we want to send people, gifts, talents, and resources "out & down." Rather than a handful doing ministry, we want to be actively giving away "ministry permission," and putting members in the best situations to succeed in their service to others. As a fellowship, we are sent out & we send out others to do the work they are called & equipped to do.

Skeptics, the unchurched, and others come to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior and become one of his disciples.

Renewed, invigorated faith

Church plants have a great track record of “saving” people’s faith, where they are able to come and process the way of Jesus anew. We will see hurt and ‘burnt’ Christians find that healing in following Jesus.

Ministries being born

We want to be a church that sends out other church planters, missionaries local & global, and interns into other ministries. We seek to be a church that is a hub for para-church ministries and non-profits that serve both locally and abroad. We want to resource & send out people to the work that God has equipped and called them to do.
